Ronald McDonald House Charities in Omaha (RMHC) provides the essential elements of home, inclusive of a warm bed, a hot shower, laundry facilities, transportation to and from the hospital, and regular nutritious meals to sick children and their families utilizing any of the area's world-class medical care facilities.

Ronald McDonald House Charities

To qualify for a stay at Nebraska's only Ronald McDonald House, families must live at least 35 miles away and have a child (up to age 21) currently receiving treatment at any medical facility in the area. Families may stay up to 15 months, or as long as necessary until their child is discharged from care. Families are referred to us by their medical provider or a hospital social worker. The mission of RMHC is to make a lasting impact on the health outcomes of the families they serve, and at the heart of this endeavor lies collaboration. To provide comprehensive support services, RMHC collaborates with various local organizations, each specializing in different aspects of well-being. Here are a few examples:

- **Option Care Home Health** delivers cutting-edge infusion medications, nursing support and seamless transitional care for patients.
- **Completely KIDS** addresses educational gaps caused by illness and travel, offering curriculum-based programs and parenting classes.
- Omaha Therapy Arts Collaborative and Project Harmony established a pre-trauma support group for the entire family's mental health needs.
- **HERE: For You For Them** equips families with mindful parenting tools, yoga, and breathing exercises to manage stress and build resilience.
- Simon Says Birthday Party Project celebrates monthly birthdays for children and parents.
- Capitol Beauty School provides haircuts in a safe and convenient manner, especially for those undergoing chemotherapy.
- Therapy Dogs Shasta and Ralphie offer invaluable in-person support.
- **Bags of Fun** crafts individually tailored toy bags for sick children.
- Project Sunshine brings Creighton University student volunteers twice a month for crafts.
- Omaha Community Playhouse engages children in writing, storytelling, acting, and imaginative play during their visits.
- **Saving Grace** receives and exchanges food items with the House depending on how each organization adheres to food expiration date protocols.

Through these partnerships, RMHC ensures holistic care and support for the families it serves.


