Our home includes warm beds, hot showers, laundry facilities, transportation to and from the hospital, and regular nutritious meals to sick children and their families utilizing any of the area's world-class medical care providers.

To qualify for a stay through the House Program at Nebraska's only Ronald McDonald House:

- Family has a child, up to age 21, currently receiving treatment at any medical facility in the area.
- Family must live at least 35 miles from the House.



The Johnson Family

Couy and Taylor Johnson were 100 miles from their families, facing unthinkable circumstances.

Taylor was just 22 weeks into her pregnancy with twins when severe back pain sent them on a two-state, three-hospital journey that ended in Omaha. Over the next week, the young couple from Wakefield, Nebraska experienced highs and, sadly, lows, beyond anything they could have expected. They were left drained physically, mentally, and emotionally.

Then they settled into their room at Ronald McDonald House Charities in Omaha.

Little by little, they found warm comforts to steady themselves. Hot coffee and a hot meal. Equipment for exercise and shelves to organize. Couy and Taylor both grew up in big families, so being surrounded by others who could relate to their situation, even slightly, was a familiar and much-needed benefit.

The ever-present chaos of the NICU caused significant stress and anxiety, but Taylor says coming to the House allowed her to "shut it all off and take a breath." Even in the midst of everything, Couy says, "You have your own little place to just relax.

"It felt like home."

The Ronald McDonald House was the Johnsons' home-away-from-home for 120 days, and right now, 40 families like them are in need of your support. Please donate today to provide them warmth and comfort in their times of crisis.





Recipes

Chocolate Chip Cookies Fruitful Feel Group

- 2 sticks butter (room temperature)
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- ½ tsp coarse or regular salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 cups chocolate chips

Directions:
Preheat oven to 350°F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, cream together butter, sugar, and brown sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Mix in vanilla.

In a separate bowl, whisk together flour, salt, and baking soda. Gradually add dry ingredients to wet ingredients, mix until just combined. Stir in chocolate chips.

Drop dough by rounded teaspoon onto prepared baking sheets.

Bake 8–12 minutes, or until cookies are golden brown.

Cool on the pan for 2–3 minutes before transferring to a wire rack for additional cooling before enjoying!

Crispy Chickpea Kale Caesar Salad Fruitful Feel Group

- 1 head curly kale, stems removed
- 1 head romaine lettuce, chopped
- olive oil (1-2 tbsps to coat chickpeas and 2 tsp to drizzle)
- salt & pepper to taste
- 1-2 avocado, cubed (optional)
- 1/4 to 1/2 cup of fresh shaved parmesan
- caesar dressing to your liking
- croutons
- 3 cans of chickpeas, drained and rinsed

Directions:
Prepare the chickpeas: Preheat oven to 400°F. Pat chickpeas dry, season with olive oil, salt, and pepper (or your favorite spices), and spread evenly on a baking sheet. Bake 20–30 minutes, shaking halfway, until golden and crispy.

Prepare the kale: Remove stems and cut kale into thin strips. Place in a large bowl, drizzle with a little olive oil, sprinkle with salt, and massage with your hands for 2–3 minutes until softened.

Assemble the salad: Add chopped romaine lettuce to the kale. Toss with Caesar dressing until evenly coated.

Add toppings: Gently fold in cubed avocado (if using), crispy chickpeas, croutons, and fresh shaved Parmesan.

Finish & serve: Season with additional salt and pepper to taste. Serve immediately and enjoy!

McDonald's Relationship

The first Ronald McDonald House opened in Philadelphia on October 15, 1974, providing care for families of sick children traveling for medical treatment.
